# Paul's emotional state on arriving

- I Corinthians 2:1-3
  - Brothers and sisters, when I came to you I **didn't come with fancy words or great wisdom**. I preached to you the truth about God's love. I made up my mind to pay attention to only one thing while I was with you. That one thing was Jesus Christ and his death on the cross.
  - When I came to you, I **was weak and afraid and trembling all over**.

# Paul's treatment by locals

- 2 Corinthians 6:9-10 But people treat us as if we were pretenders. We are known, but people treat us as if we were unknown. We are dying, but we continue to live. We are beaten, but we are not killed. We are sad, but we are always full of joy. We are poor, but we make many people rich. We have nothing, but we own everything.

# Situation at the time



- Paul had not been successful planting a church in Athens!
- Corinth was a Party Town
  - Commercial crossroad of Greece
  - location of Aphrodite's (goddess of love) temple with over 1000 priests/prostitutes
- Tiberius Claudius Caesar Augustus Germanicus
  - Was Roman Emperor from 41 to 54 A.D.
  - He took over from the most vicious Emperor of Rome - Caligula
  - He probably ejected Christian Jews to satisfy the Italian Jewish community

# Tent making

- Probably learned his trade in Tarsus (his home town)
- Fully self-supporting
- Not a burden on his community
- Worked alongside others providing services for those that did not know Jesus
- Allowed relationships that formed to show others Jesus.
- Let's see how he did in Corinth. . .



# Tried to get the religious to come alongside

- Used logic and reason – Greeks invented these tools of the trade
- Started out this work in his normal “church” environment only on the Sabbath

I am innocent of it. From now on I will go to the Gentiles.”

When a few gathered that were like minded he extended this to weekdays

- He gave up tent making and only preached
- He must have already saved enough money at that stage, so he didn't need to earn
- He took time away from WORK to teach others about JESUS.
- He took RISK doing this. . .how did it work out?

# Shakes his clothes out...

- Note similarity to Luke 9:3-5 where Jesus said
  - "Don't take anything for the journey. Do not take a walking stick or a bag. Do not take any bread, money or extra clothes. When you are invited into a house, stay there until you leave town. Some people may not welcome you. If they don't, **shake the dust off your feet** when you leave their town. This will be a witness against the people living there."
- Symbolically he was saying he was taking nothing from them. . .shaking clothes showed he had nothing hidden!

# I am innocent of it,

- If people reject supporting Jesus and our guidance, we are not to continue bugging them.
- At a certain point, they have full responsibility for their decision.
- Provided we do not take anything from these people, we will not be found guilty for ignoring them.
- We need to realize if one path is blocked we need to look for another path in life, he turns to unbelievers who are willing to listen.

# Paul starts a house church

- Right next door in the same neighbourhood
- Similar to how we have started SGC celebrate together with Birchdale in Kearney, alongside other churches.
