Nubia and Egypt

"In 2300 BC, Nubia was first mentioned in Old Kingdom Egyptian accounts of trade missions. From Aswan, right above the First Cataract, southern limit of Egyptian control at the time, Egyptians imported gold, incense, ebony, ivory, and exotic animals from tropical Africa through Nubia.



About 1000 miles/1600km to Jerusalem

This man had gone to Jerusalem to worship, ²⁸ and on his way home was sitting in his chariot reading the Book of Isaiah the prophet. ²⁹ The Spirit told Philip, "Go to that chariot and stay near it."

Do you think this guy was Jewisi How would he have been reading the Book of Isaiah?

> Philip couldn't have been carrying much or keeping up with the chariot would have been tough wouldn't it?

Then Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the man reading Isaiah the prophet. "Do you understand what you are reading?" Philip asked.

Chariots had a top speed of about 30km/h but this was probably doing about 8 to 16 km/hr or Philip could not have been able to keep pace with it.

Do you think Philip just ran up and started talking immediately?

"How can I," he said, "unless someone explains it to me?" So he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. ³² This is the passage of Scripture the eunuch was reading:

- "He was led like a sheep to the slaughter, and as a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he did not open his mouth.
- ³³ In his humiliation he was deprived of justice.
 Who can speak of his descendants?
 For his life was taken from the earth."

What would this have made Philip think of?

Would the text from Isaiah have been confusing?

Isaiah 53 New International Version (NIV)

53 Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed? 2 He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground. He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. З. He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain. Like one from whom people hide their faces he was despised, and we held him in low esteem. ³⁴ The eunuch asked Philip, "Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else?" ³⁵ Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the good news about Jesus. Could you or I have explained what Philip explained?

As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said,

"Look, here is water. What can stand in the way of my being baptized?"

Why was Baptism important?

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Matthew 28

Perhaps what had Philip

told him?

As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said,

"Look, here is water. What can stand in the way of my being baptized?"

And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him.

Was this a public event?

When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord suddenly took Philip away, and the eunuch did not see him again, but went on his way rejoicing.

Was Philips "transporter" experience seen by others?

Philip, however, appeared at Azotus and traveled about, preaching the gospel in all the towns until he reached Caesarea.

Azotus is slightly inland from the Mediteranian Sea, a short distance north of modern day Gaza.

Caesarea, the great port and capital of Roman Judea, is slightly south of the former Roman Tetrach province of Galalee.

To go from Azotus to Caesarea you would travel northward from Judea through Samaria across the Plain of Sharon.
