


JAMES A BROTHER OF JESUS

(PAST SESSIONS REVIEW)


We looked at James history as a brother of Jesus and leader in the church



We considered the 12 tribes and 10 lost tribes




we looked wisdom from God that is not IQ or schooling

EASTER

Where does the term **Easter** come from?

*Nothing to do with
JESUS*

The modern English term *Easter*, cognate with modern German *Ostern*, developed from the Old English word *Ēastre* or *Ēostre*. This is generally held to have originally referred to the name of an Anglo-Saxon goddess, *Ēostre*, a form of the widely attested Indo-European dawn goddess

Eástre (1909) by Jacques Reich. Directly derived from Gehrts' image (above), with the addition of Germanic worshipers replaced by a picturesque landscape



Did the Church use this word?

In Greek and Latin, the Christian celebration was and is called Πάσχα, **Pascha**, words derived, through Aramaic, from the Hebrew term **Pesach** (, (noð known in English as **Passover**, which originally denoted the Jewish festival commemorating the story of the Exodus.[29][30]

Already in the 50s of the 1st century, Paul, writing from Ephesus to the Christians in Corinth,[applied the term to Christ, and it is **unlikely that the Ephesian and Corinthian Christians were the first to hear Exodus 12 interpreted as speaking about the death of Jesus, not just about the Jewish Passover ritual.** In most of the non-English speaking world, the feast is known by names derived from Greek and Latin Pascha

Early Christianity made a pragmatic move doing replacement of ancient pagan practices with Christian.

What is the most common modern mis-understood aspect of Easter in the Church?

Matthew 12:40 For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of a huge fish, so the Son of Man will be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.

(Jesus speaking!)

Our faith is based on a major falsehood, or
is it?

The Bible Says...

Matthew 12:40 For as Jonah was **three days and three nights** in the belly of a huge fish, so the Son of Man will be **three days and three nights** in the heart of the earth.

(Jesus speaking!)

Matthew 26:55 The chief priests and the whole Sanhedrin were looking for false evidence against Jesus so that they could put him to death. But they did not find any, though many false witnesses came forward. Finally two came forward and declared, “This fellow said, ‘I am able to destroy the temple of God and rebuild it in **three days.**’”

The Bible Says...

Matthew 27:39-41 Those who passed by hurled insults at him, shaking their heads and saying, “You who are going to destroy the temple and build it in **three days**, save yourself! Come down from the cross, if you are the Son of God!”

Matthew 27:62-64 The next day, the one after Preparation Day, the chief priests and the Pharisees went to Pilate. “Sir,” they said, “we remember that while he was still alive that deceiver said, ‘After three days I will rise again.’ So give the order for the tomb to be made secure until the **third day**. Otherwise, his disciples may come and steal the body and tell the people that he has been raised from the dead. This last deception will be worse than the first.”

Many Christian's seem to ignore a fact
that is central to their faith,

if Jesus died Good Friday afternoon
and rose Easter Sunday morning

he wasn't in the grave 3 days
(ancient or modern!)



SABBATH

- Leviticus 3:23
- There are six days when you may work, but the seventh day is a day of **sabbath** rest, a day of sacred assembly. You are not to do any work; wherever you live, it is a sabbath to the LORD.

SPECIAL SABBATH

- John 19:31
- Now it was the day of Preparation, and the next day was to be a **special Sabbath**. Because the Jewish leaders did not want the bodies left on the crosses during the Sabbath, they asked Pilate to have the legs broken and the bodies taken down.

The guards posted on the day after the day of preparation ...

- The next day, the one after Preparation Day, the chief priests and the Pharisees went to Pilate. “Sir,” they said, “we remember that while he was still alive that deceiver said, ‘After three days I will rise again.’ So give the order for the tomb to be made secure until the third day. Otherwise, his disciples may come and steal the body and tell the people that he has been raised from the dead. This last deception will be worse than the first.” “Take a guard,” Pilate answered. “Go, make the tomb as secure as you know how.” So they went and made the tomb secure by putting a seal on the stone and posting the guard.





Jesus entered Jerusalem and went into the temple courts. He looked around at everything, but since it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the Twelve.





When he reached it, he found nothing but leaves, because it was not the season for figs. Then he said to the tree, **“May no one ever eat fruit from you again.”** And his disciples heard him say it

On reaching Jerusalem, Jesus entered the temple courts and began driving out those who were buying and selling there. He overturned the tables of the money changers and the benches of those selling doves, and would not allow anyone to carry merchandise through the temple courts.

Verse 19: When evening came, Jesus and his disciples went out of the city.

MARK 14: Now the Passover and the Festival of Unleavened Bread were only two days away

While he was in Bethany, reclining at the table in the home of Simon the Leper, a woman came with an alabaster jar of very expensive perfume, made of pure nard. She broke the jar and poured the perfume on his head.

In the morning, as they went along, they saw **the fig tree withered from the roots.**

Peter remembered and said to Jesus, “Rabbi, look! The fig tree you cursed has withered!”





Jesus goes towards a desperate situation...

He went a little farther. Then he fell with his face to the ground. He prayed, “My Father, if it is possible, take this cup of suffering away from me. But let what you want be done, not what I want.”

All fail him..

Right away a rooster crowed.⁷⁵ Then Peter remembered what Jesus had said. “The rooster will crow,” Jesus had told him. “Before it does, you will say three times that you don’t know me.” Peter went outside. He broke down and sobbed.

He is killed..

After Jesus cried out again in a loud voice, he died

A time is coming....

Then I saw a scroll in the right hand of the One sitting on the throne. The scroll had writing on both sides. It was sealed with seven seals.

² I saw a mighty angel calling out in a loud voice, “Who is worthy to break the seals and open the scroll?” ³ But no one in heaven or on earth or under the earth could open the scroll. No one could even look inside it.

⁴ I cried and cried because no one was found who was worthy to open the scroll or look inside.

⁵ Then one of the elders said to me, “Do not cry! The Lion of the tribe of Judah has won the battle. He is the Root of David. He is able to break the seven seals and open the scroll.”

⁶ Then I saw a Lamb that looked as if he had been put to death. He stood in the center of the area around the throne. The Lamb was surrounded by the four living creatures and the elders. He had seven horns and seven eyes. The eyes stand for the seven spirits of God, which are sent out into all the earth.

⁷ The Lamb came and took the scroll from the right hand of the One sitting on the throne. ⁸ Then the four living creatures and the 24 elders fell down in front of the Lamb. Each one had a harp. They were holding golden bowls full of incense, which stand for the prayers of God's people.
