JESUS AND CHRISTMAS DAY



Wikipedia correctly says...

Christmas or Christmas Day is a holiday observed generally on December 25 to commemorate the birth of Jesus, the central figure of Christianity. The date is not known to be the actual birthday of Jesus, and may have initially been chosen to correspond with either the day exactly nine months after some early Christians believed Jesus had been conceived, the date of the Roman winter solstice, or one of various ancient winter festivals

Jesus birthday?

 December 25 is very unlikely to be Jesus' actual day of birth.

The reason is nobody knows the exact day Jesus was born! We have hints in the bible but no certainty.



Firstly let us just **look at the word Christmas**, it is **built of two words Christ and Mass**. For those not in a church that uses the term "Mass" is a term used to describe a remembrance of Jesus' death on the cross.

It is interesting that at a birth of a baby, we name it after remembrance of his death! This is, I guess, because his greatest life's work was his death and the subsequent resurrection!



Perhaps the early Church decided on the date to overwhelm another celebration, that of the Roman winter solstice celebration, which occurred on 25th December. They wanted to celebrate Jesus birth and so this date was useful. This probably happened a few centuries after Jesus lived.



Okay, so how can we be fairly sure Jesus was not born in December?

Well Luke says...

While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

And there were **shepherds living out in the fields** nearby, keeping **watch over their flocks at night**.[



Okay, so how can we be fairly sure Jesus was not born in December?

The shepherds were out with their flocks and it appeared to be lambing season. We know from other secular writings that in that part of the world it was too cold at night to be out in December and so the month would have had to have had a warmer **night** for them to be out.





Another piece of information that hints it was not winter was Luke 2:1

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a **census** should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to their own town to register



To get accurate figures, they would try and avoid a census in winter because due to the cold the people would be less likely to comply correctly and travel (people travelled on foot and had to stay out some nights). This again points to a warmer month.

Okay, so now we can assume it's not winter, and some people suggest Fall (Autumn), but there is no evidence for that either. The time it occurred is perhaps not the most important aspect, maybe it's the meaning...

...what is the meaning?

I asked a tweenager what he considered Christmas was about, and the first words that he spoke were "Santa"

or as in South Africa and other parts of the world we say Father Christmas!)

Penny(my wife) and I suggested there may be something else that it was about...

...he offered "presents", "candy" and I am sure if we had allowed him to continue he would have said "lights", "holly", "Christmas jingles", "fun" and other things that are propounded in the popular culture beliefs. The time Jesus was born occurred is perhaps not the most important aspect, maybe it's the meaning...

...what is the meaning?

Personally, it seems to me as I review the Christmas milieu, that from a business perspective, Christmas is all about money and greed. These thoughts make me think of Jesus overthrowing the money changers in the temple and saying "My house will be called a house where people can pray.' (Isaiah 56:7) But you are making it a 'den for robbers." (Jeremiah 7:11)" Matthew 21:13 NIRV.

How much of Christmas is about praying... (that's talking to God)...

and not about **stuffing ourselves with food,** getting more things that cannot follow us into eternity, and **ignoring those in need around** us?

Christmas is NOT about the things most people have made it out to be! I find it saddening that even the nativity scene everyone propounds is a lie.





What's wrong about this?

The star appeared after Jesus was born, was around for about two years and moved continually only coming to rest over the place where Jesus was (and not necessarily where he was born) after two years of moving about.

So, Jesus was born into a middle class home! One artistic rendition of the type of structure is shown below...(okay so I'm the artist...please be gentle)

These houses had more than one living area.

The guest room (or prophets rooms as it is sometimes called) was reserved for honoured guests (so we can see **Joseph and Mary were not considered honoured guests**).

Then there was a living area where the rest of the family lived and slept, probably the area that Jesus was born in.

Then there was a **lower area into which the livestock was brought in during the cold nights.** This was their heating mechanism. The animals body heat helped keep the place warm. Jesus didn't actually get born on Christmas day and it's not really his birthday, but it is the day the world has chosen to celebrate his birthday. It's great to have a party, but let's not ignore the person for whom the party has been organized
